About this Evening Seminar

In many jurisdictions, the three dimensions of Arbitration, Mediation and Adjudication have become settled, perhaps even fossilized, as the three dispute resolution processes outside litigation. Demarcation lines have been drawn and may not be crossed, e.g. English case law prevents an arbitrator or adjudicator in a reference acting as mediator then reverting to his original role. In contrast, CIETAC and BAC rules expressly provide for this and German judges have a statutory obligation to try to settle cases before or during trial.

This seminar will address a range of Non-Mediation ADR processes, particularly hybrid ones, and will invite participants to join the speakers on a voyage to the outer limits of Known Space – and Beyond.

About the Speakers

Mr Hew R. Dundas, Chartered Arbitrator, DipICArb, CEDR-Accredited Mediator is the President Elect for the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators with effect from 1 January 2007. A Chartered Arbitrator, since May 2003, he is in full-time practice as Sole Practitioner in Dispute Resolution. Between 1998 and 2001, he practised as Dundas Energy Services providing legal, commercial and insurance advice to the oil and gas industry based on his expertise derived from more than 20 years in the oil and gas industry. As an arbitrator, he has been involved in SIAC and ICC cases, disputes involving multinational oil companies and involving State-controlled entities. As a CEDR-Accredited Mediator, he recently mediated in an oil industry dispute of approx \$15 million between two non-UK parties. He also contributes his expertise to publishers of arbitration journals ie “ARBITRATION” (journal of CIArb), “International Arbitration News”, International Litigation Quarterly, “Treteiskiy Sud” (Moscow), “International Commercial Arbitration” (Moscow) and “Asian Dispute Review” (Hong Kong), among others. Aside from writing and publishing his own arbitration/dispute resolution law newsletter, he maintains his own website (www.dundasarbitrator.com) that carries over 500,000 words of open-access, searchable publications on arbitration law and related topics.

Mr Loong Seng Onn, LL.B is an Executive Director of the Singapore Mediation Centre and holds a concurrent appointment as Assistant Director of the Singapore Academy of Law. He also sits on the Board of Commissioners for Oaths and Notaries Public. He is an Accredited Mediator of the Singapore Mediation Centre and the Centre for Dispute Resolution in the United Kingdom. He has also been gazetted as a mediator for the Tribunal for the Maintenance of Parents.

About the Chairperson

Mr Patrick Chia is an Architect and Arbitrator. He was recently elected as Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators. He is the first Vice President of the Singapore Institute of Architects and the Chairman of its Alternative Dispute Resolution Committee. He is also a Member of the Complaints Panel of the Singapore Medical Council, Member of the Panel of Adjudicators of the Singapore Mediation Centre and Member of the Panel of Experts for the Primary Dispute Resolution Centre, Subordinate Courts.
