1. Comparative examination of disputed and undisputed signatures and handwriting
2. Determining the sequence in which files or notes have been prepared;
3. Determining the sources of anonymous letters or notes
4. Detection of unauthorised or fraudulent alterations of documents, including page substitutions
5. Restoration of erased, leached, faded, obscured or obliterated entries on documents
6. Determining the relative date on which entries are written
7. Visualisation and sequencing of latent handwriting impressions
8. Examination of typewritten and computer-generated documents
9. Chemical analysis of inks and papers
10. Forensic computer examination
