### About this Evening Seminar

The Law Society and the Singapore Institute of Arbitrators are proud to present an evening seminar featuring two world famous experts in international arbitration and chaired by Michael Hwang SC.

VV VEEDER QC of Essex Court Chambers is one of the top QCs in England specialising in international arbitration and is considered by many to be the leading advocate in international arbitration at the English Bar. He has served as Vice-President of the London Court of International Arbitration as well as Chairman of its Board of Directors. He will speak on the following topics:-

- “Foreign Law as Evidence or Argument”. This talk will deal with the question whether foreign law needs to be proved in an international arbitration by witness evidence (and cross examination) or simply by submissions from counsel.
- “Cross Examination before a Bicultural Tribunal”. This talk will deal with the approach to be taken by counsel in an international arbitration where the tribunal includes one or more civilian lawyers not accustomed to traditional cross examination.

KENNETH ROKISON QC of 20 Essex Street Chambers enjoyed a highly successful career as a commercial silk before deciding to become a full time arbitrator. He is arguably the most well known English arbitrator in international arbitration. Like VV Veeder, he has been Vice-President of the London Court of International Arbitration and Chairman of its Board of Directors. He will speak on the topic of “Different Styles of Submission in International Arbitration”. This talk will deal with how advocates from different legal traditions present their arguments in international arbitration.
